1. Call to Order, President's Welcome

Meeting called to order at 6:04 PM. President welcomed attendees and acknowledged the community's continued involvement and support.

2. Treasurer's Report – Gill

- Main Account: \$20,852.38
- Gaming Account: \$3,656.25
- Stripe: \$2,414.99
- Total: \$26,923.62
- Based on approved spending not yet paid out, the working balance is approx. \$3,000.
- Financial Caution: All future spending must account for outstanding commitments

3. Funding Requests

AIRS Program

- Presented by Maggie, AIRS teacher
- Program integrates Indigenous knowledge, environmental awareness, and place-based learning focused on the Saint George Rainway project.
- All classes participated in reflective art, storytelling, drumming, and song creation connected to land, water, and community.
- Students learned about the past, present, and future of local water systems and indigenous biodiversity.
- PAC provided Funding for the AIRS project in September (refer to SEP 30 meeting): \$1,500 for costs (tour and elder presentation) and supplies
- The program concludes with a ceremony and open house on Friday, June 6th:
 - **Ceremony (1:30–3:00 PM):** Indigenous drumming, student procession with banners, community speakers, and a new school song written by students
 - **Open House (3:00–6:00 PM):** Art displays inside the school; families and community members welcome

Primary Field Trip Bus Request

- Request: \$1,260 for medium and large bus (108 students, 30 adults)
- Gavin to cover approx. 40%; PAC approved to fund up to 50% (~\$630)
- Motion by Dorian, seconded by Miranda. Passed.

Recess Equipment Refresh

- Request for updated bins and equipment to improve playground activity
- Plan:
 - **12 bins** (one per division for next year)
 - Colour-coded and labelled gear (e.g., ropes, balls, chalk)
 - Student-led sign-out system (e.g., clothespin responsibility system)
 - Teachers to provide input on class needs (e.g., badminton, soccer balls)
 - Intermediate classes may request pickleball gear
 - Items will be spray-painted or labelled with MTP PAC logo for easy return
 - Donations from families are welcome (e.g., lightly used gear)
- Funding approved up to \$1,000
- Motion by Brandon, seconded by Megan. Passed.

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Parent Question

"Our classroom uses Prodigy and other online games, and our recent report card said that we should promote the use of them at home as well. Do we really need to introduce video games at such a young age? We were trying to avoid them for as long as possible, and now we're feeling the consequences because she was taught to play them at school — behavioural issues, increased addiction to screens, zombie-like behaviour and lack of listening. I've watched her play these games and they don't seem very educational at all."

Principal's Response:

This is a classroom-level decision. The principal recommended discussing directly with the classroom teacher to share concerns and better understand how online games are integrated into the curriculum.
